Notes:

The center backstitching is not necessary, it's just to outline where the 8X10 picture will go. Cut the fabric approximately 4 or 5 squares inside the stitched area, cut CAREFULLY diagonally to the corners of the stitched area, fold under and use a fabric glue to hold it in place. Use double sided tape to put the photograph on a piece of thin cardboard, use your fabric glue to glue the cross stitched piece onto the cardboard, fold the edges under the cardboard and glue and the entire piece is ready for an 11" X 14" picture frame.
